I met Stephan Tanner Ph.D., owner of Swiss Tropicals, several years ago at the Catfish Convention in Northern Virginia. He was selling filtration products which utilize a "Poret" filtering material imported from Germany. I took home a couple of small filters and I have used them very successfully over the past several years.

Recently he has come out with two additional items which also seemed very promising for use in the fishroom. The first item is what he refers to as the BetterBoxFilter. It works on the same principles as the original filters utilizing the Poret filter material and his patented Jetlifter device. The real difference is everything is encased in a plastic container. The Jetlifter device pulls water down through the filter material and then forces the clean water back up the device. The Jetlifter can be configured to permit the clean water to rise toward the surface or to be directed at a 90 degree across the aquarium. The Poret material comes in several filtering densities ranging from 10PPI and 45PPI. **




The BetterBoxFilter leverages their unique Jetlifter and Poret foam combination to create a new, simple, and flexible approach to the age-old box filter.



To clean the filter you simply remove the material from the aquarium, remove the Jetlifter and rinse the filter material under the faucet until the water runs clear. You then replace the Jetlifter back into the filter material and place the filter back in the tank. Depending on how much you feed, will obviously determine how often you clean the filter. With the original filters I purchased I tend to clean them about evert 6-8 weeks. Having the box filter for only several weeks; sufficient time has not passed to do the initial cleaning.

The second item is not a filter but is an equally interesting product. Stephan refers to it as the German Breeding Rings (GBR). The invention was developed by a number of German Pleco breeders. The device is a floating, egg-hatching, and fry-rearing incubator with an integrated mini-Jetlifter that continuously supplies the round holding chamber with fresh water.



Small (4-inch) and Large (6-inch) German Breeding Rings, a new style of aquarium fish egg and fry incubator from Swiss Tropicals.

Intended for use raising small batches of almost any type of fry, the rings have a bottom covered with 30-micron nylon gauze. That means you can feed fry with Artemia nauplia (baby brine shrimp), rotifers, or copepods without flushing the live food out.

This side view (below) of the large German Breeding Ring clearly shows the round floating incubation chamber, with the integrated Jetlifter rising up to the chamber with a small foam block covering the intake below. An air feed is attached to the small gray barb on the white lifter tube; flow could be adjusted with an inline needle valve or gang valve (not included).



Because GBRs float on the surface of a bigger tank, they can be used in the spawning aquarium so that water quality remains much more stable and the larvae or fry do not disperse over a large area, which would make them difficult to feed adequately. The device comes in two sizes a 4" and a 6" diameter.


